A. Call Meeting to Order: Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley opened the meeting

6:00 PM Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley opened Public Hearing for the purpose of Real Property Tax Exemption for Cold War Veterans

Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley stated that this Law would allow the Cold War Veteran exemptions for the County and those municipalities to be granted permanently and not expire after a ten-year limit. This has been suggested by St. Lawrence County Real Property.

Tom Woodside of 258 Miner St Rd, Canton NY spoke in favor of this Law as defined in the County Real Property Law.

### D. Approval of minutes: November 14, 2018 Regular Meeting

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to approve minutes of November 14, 2018, second by Council Member Jim Smith. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

### E. Supervisor Report:

John Gray gave a verbal report on the fund balances. Gray added that the 2017 AUD has been accepted and finalized. Gray stated that this was very time consuming due to prior years numbers and how they tracked into the 2017 numbers. The Gray and Gray firm are still working on the last four years of Health Districts. Mary Ann Ashley stated for the record that 11 bank accounts were closed to help streamline the accounting. The accounts were savings and money market accounts along with one sewer account that had no balance. Ashley added that the approximately \$9,600.00 will be transferred to the appropriate accounts.

### G. Approval of Department Reports

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to approve Department Head reports, seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

### H. Committee Reports:

Committee Member Jim Smith reported that the Comprehensive Plan will be meeting on Monday December 17, 2018 with the Consultants and the committee members. Smith will report back to the Town board with an update.

### I. Old Business

1. Consider Real Property Tax Exemption for Cold War Vets ten-year limitation:

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to pass LL#2-2018 to remove the ten-year limitation of Cole War Vets, seconded by Council Member Bob Washo. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

Council Member Tim Danehy stated for the record that eligibility is for your primary residence only and will be handled through the Assessor's Office.

2. Consider Solar Moratorium Extension;

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to pass LL#3-2018 to extend the moratorium to the end of March 31, 2019. Seconded by Council Member Jim Smith. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

3. Vital Statistics Registrar Districts Consolidation – Village of Rensselaer Falls/Town of Canton

The State requested that the Village of Rensselaer Falls/Town of Canton consolidate Vital records. The Village of Rensselaer Falls Attorney Henry Leader reviewed and approved this transfer upon acceptance of the Town doing so. Draft resolutions were provided by the State. The matter will be placed on the Year end meeting date for approval. Town Attorney Eric Gustafson to also review draft resolutions provided by the State.

4. Pyrites Hydro Project and Re-Licensing Input Letter to Enel Green Power

Webb encouraged the Town of Canton to send a comment letter and or any recommendations into Enel Green Power North America to have a voice in the process by Mid-January 2019. This letter will be drafted after Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley hears back from Waterfront Advisory Committee.

5. NYS Retirement Standard Workday Resolution

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to accepted resolution as presented, seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

### Canton Capital Resource Corporation Board of Directors Appointments Resolution

Discussion was held on the appointments of officers to the CCRC. The following people are willing to serve and to take responsibility of reviewing a yearly audit of the organization. The town's only involvement is to appoint the 5 new members. The CCRC originally formed in 2010 to issue bonds for construction of a \$30 million-dollar dormitory at SUNY Canton. Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley and the Town Board members worked in concert to find and appoint the following members: John Gray of Colton, Lyndon Allen of Potsdam, Benjamin Dixon, William E. Irven and Brian Gardam all of Canton.

Council Member Tim Danehy made a motion to appoint new members to the CCRC board, seconded by Council Member Bob Washo. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

Council Members Bob Washo and Tim Danehy thanked the new board members for their willingness to serve.

### 7. Riverside Renaissance Grant Update:

Discussion was held on the current situation of the grant for \$462,548.00 award for acquition and demolition of a piece of property located on Riverside Drive, to design a white-water park in the Village and a under bridge walkway. Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley reminded the board that this was never budgeted for and the matter was turned over to the Economic Steering Committee. Ashley added that memorandum of agreements were never done. It was recommended by the committee to send the Grant offer back to the State. Council Member Jim Smith stated that the work is being done in the Village and yet the Town of Canton is doing the applying for the grant.

Council Member Tim Danehy authorized Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley to return the grant to the Department of State along with working with Economic Developer Leigh Rodriguez to do this in an appropriate manner. Seconded by Council Member Jim Smith. All voted in Favor. Motion carries.

### 8. Oswegatchie River Plan Update:

Supervisor Mary Ann Ashely reported to the board members that she had met with surrounding Towns and Village officials recently about the grant. Town of Dekalb, Oswegatchie, Village of Rensselaer Falls and Heuvelton were in attendance. Ashley remined the board members that this also was not budgeted for but yet a contract was signed. Ashley requested permission to

hire a consultant to do an inventory of the River, using the reimbursement money that was received from the Blueway grant reimbursement. Discussion was held at this meeting about contributions from each municipality. Ashley stated that she thought that the Town of Dekalb may contribute and that the Town of Oswegatchie and Village of Heuvelton will not be. Ashley added that she was unsure of the Village of Rensselaer Falls at this time. All these municipalities have the Oswegatchie River running through them. Ashley stated that she has great concerns about the past history of the Town of Canton taking on the lead for projects in other municipalities and paid for it all and this can no longer happen.

### J. New Business

1. CSEA Highway agreement with the Town of Canton:

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to accept the 1-1-2018 through 12-31-2021 Highway Agreement as presented. Seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor, motion carries. Copy of agreement filed in Town Clerks Office

2. Town Planning Board Appointment Five Year Term through 12-31-2023

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to re-appoint Deb Backus to a five-year term of 12-31-2023, seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

3. Shared Service Agreements with the Village of Canton:

Approval was given on shared service agreements between the Town and Village of Canton which include the Historian, Code Enforcement, Economic Development Service, Assessor Town Court and the Municipal Building. Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley stated that the committees are still working on similar agreements for Recreation and IT.

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to approve presented agreements, seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

4. Gray & Gray Associates, CPA Professional Services 2019 Agreement

Council Member Tim Danehy made a motion to endorse and sign agreement with Gray & Gray at \$4,150.00 a month, \$2,500.00 to prepare the Annual Audit Report and an additional \$2,000 to prepare 2020 budget with a maximum of fifteen hours. Seconded by Council Member Jim Smith, all voted in favor. Motion carries.

### 5. Pease & Gustafson Professional Services 2019 Agreement

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to continue in agreement with Pease & Gustafson for \$150.00 an hour, plus any additional fees. Seconded by Council Member Tim Danehy. All voted in favor, motion carries.

### 6. Joint Ethics Committee Appointments:

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to appoint Tedra Cobb and Marianne DiMarco-Tempkin to the Town/Village of Canton Joint Ethics Committee, seconded by Council Member Bob Washo. All voted in favor, motion carries.

Cobb and DiMarco-Tempkin will work with Katie Murphy and Natasha Komarov of the Village of Canton as a task force committee to look at Canton Code of Ethics.

### 7. NYS Firefighters Cancer Coverage Insurance

Supervisor Ashley stated that she received notice from the Association of Towns that all municipalities will have to cover fire fighters with Cancer Coverage Insurance by January 1st, 2019, as this is a nonfunded mandate. Discussion was held the fact that Pyrites would be the only Fire Department that the Town would need to look at for coverage. Ashley wants to hold off until Attorney Gustafson looks into the matter and brings a recommendation back to the board for further discussion at the yearend meeting. A quote was received at \$156.00 per interior fire fighter from Hartford Insurance.

### 8. Health Insurance Contribution Discussion:

Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley stated that the board has been looking at all expenditures and revenues. Ashley said that they noticed that the health insurance contributions have not met the standard that the board is expecting as far as things being recorded properly. Ashley said some retires were highway employees and contractual language was not administered.

Council Member Bob Washo stated that the Towns premiums have went up, and the costs weren't passed on to the retirees and so therefore their percentages have gone down. Washo added that there are a lot of discrepancies in what employees and retirees are paying and that invoices and tracking of past records is nonexistent.

Council Member Jim Smith stated that the new agreement with the highway has highway employee's contribution at 16.5%, with new hires at 20%. Smith

added that the retirees contribution was set at 50% a long time ago and now it all over the board at 20%.

### 9. Set year-end meeting date

Council Member Jim Smith made a motion to hold a year end meeting on December 31, 2018 at 11:00 AM, seconded by Council Member Bob Washo All voted in favor. Motion carries.

### 10. Green Living Resolution:

Council Member Bob Washo made a motion to approve the Green Living Resolution, seconded by Council Member Jim Smith. All voted in favor. Motion carries.

### K. Public Comment: none


