The position was originally funded by Town and Village, but the Town recently decided that a full-time person is needed just for Town business. This is a Civil Service position. There was not a complete list available, which allowed the Town to advertise. The Town received five applications and interviewed three individuals. The appointee is a 2008 Canton Central graduate with Bachelor of Science degree in Biology. She is serving as a Senior Public Health Inspector for the Town of Brookline, Massachusetts and she's been doing that since 2014. Motion to provisionally appoint Miranda Corbine as the next Town Code Enforcement Officer effective April 12, 2021, with an annual salary of \$53,375 made by Martha Foley Smith, 2nd by Bob Washo.
